#### **April 22, 2010 - Depart Local Airport for Charlotte, NC**

#### **April 23, 2010 - Biltmore House – Festival of Flowers, Asheville, N.C.**

This morning we will tour the Biltmore House, America's largest private residence. This beautiful mansion was a home for the Vanderbilt Family, the largest single family dwelling in the country and covers more than 125,000 square feet. The beauty of this grand home extends out-of-doors to its gardens and managed woodland

**April 24, 2010 - The Cove – Home of Billy Graham**

These three days will prove to be the highlight of your tour! Our time will include singing, bible study, workshops and much more!

**April 25, 2010 – Asheville, N.C. to Pigeon Forge, TN**

Today as we leave The Cove, we will take the scenic route through the Smoky Mountains into Cherokee. There is no other travel destination quite like Cherokee, so prepare yourself to open your mind and begin to fathom the complex and often heartbreaking history of the Cherokee people. Our tour will take us into the Tennessee side of the mountains, pass the Chimneys and Morton Overlook with panoramic picture stops along the way. Don't forget your camera!

**April 26, 2010 – Pigeon Forge, TN**

Dollywood's Festival of Nations, a large scale international festival, will host more than 400 performers from over 15 countries bringing their music, dance, costumes and culture to Dollywood! This multi-cultural event offers a sampling of international cuisine and crafts native to the countries represented. Back by popular demand, the world-renowned Moscow Circus brings audiences to their feet with spectacular artistry. Tonight's dinner is at the "Old Mill."

**April 27, 2010 – Pigeon Forge to Nashville, TN**

Today we make our way to the heart of Country Music - Nashville! This afternoon after checking into our hotel, you will have time to explore the more than 200 restaurants, stores and performance based venues at the Opry Mills Mall. After dinner you have reserved seats at the World Famous Grand Ole Opry. Each show will feature over 20 acts from the legendary stars to new upcoming young talent.

**April 28, 2010 – Nashville, TN**

After breakfast we will tour the Historic RCA Studio B, the oldest surviving recording studio in Nashville and one of the most famous studios in the world. Then with a local guide we will drive by the homes of the stars, through the historic downtown, Music Row and the Governor's Mansion. A highlight of the day will be lunch at the Wildhorse Saloon, where you can have fun with your boots on! After lunch you will tour Ryman Auditorium, "The Carnegie Hall of the South." Visit the building that was the Grand Ole Opry's home for over 30 years. Have your picture taken in front of a life size bronze statue of Roy Acuff and Minnie Pearl. Tonight we will have dinner at the beautiful Gaylord Opryland Resort. After dinner take time to explore the winding walkways and view the waterfalls and foliage in the conservatory, a two acre garden under glass. Visit the Cascades, a water themed wing of the resort covering two acres. The new exciting Delta area has a scenic river boat ride under the four and half acre glass roof.

**April 29, 2010 – Nashville to Memphis, TN**

Today our travels take us to Memphis, known as the "Home of the Blues & Birthplace of Rock 'n' Roll - not to mention gospel, jazz, rap and soul. Upon arrival in Memphis you will enjoy some free time and lunch on Beale Street. If good food in authentic settings appeals to you, be sure and visit Itta Bena, a warm, friendly place to eat, drink, and have fun in an historic Beale Street environment. Tonight you'll enjoy a BBQ dinner at one of more than 100 barbecue restaurants in Memphis.

**April 30, 2010 – Memphis, TN**

Today's tour takes us to Graceland, home of Elvis Presley, the second most visited private home in the United States next to the White House in Washington, D.C. After lunch we will have a 3 hour city tour of Memphis ending at the Peabody Hotel, famous for the "March of the Peabody Ducks." Tonight's dinner will be at the Capriccio Grill in the Peabody Hotel.
